<p style="text-align: center;"><b>5101:2-12-27</b></p> <p>(A) The child care center shall have in all center buildings and readily accessible during all operating hours at least one child care staff member for each of the following trainings who has successfully completed current and valid training in:</p> <p>(4) Child abuse recognition and prevention.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>5101:2-12-10</b></p> <p>(1) A center shall have at least one child care staff member on-site (in each building) during all hours of operation who is currently trained in the following (more than one person may be used to meet the requirements of this paragraph).</p> <p>(d) Child abuse recognition and prevention six-hour training.</p> <p>(2) Every administrator, child care staff member, including substitutes, shall be current with the ODJFS prescribed one-hour child abuse overview which is valid for two years, unless the child care staff member is current with the six-hour training or three-hour refresher course in paragraph (A)(1)(d) of this rule. This shall be taken within the first thirty days of hire.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>5101:2-13-27</b></p> <p>(A) The child care type A home shall have readily accessible in the home during all operation hours at least one adult employee who has currently valid training in the areas listed in paragraphs (A)(1) to (A) (4) of this rule.</p> <p>(4) Child abuse recognition and prevention.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>5101:2-13-10</b></p> <p>(A) What health training is required for a licensed family child care provider prior to licensure?</p> <p>The family child care provider shall complete the following:</p> <p>(2) Have a current training in management of communicable disease and the six-hour child abuse recognition and prevention.</p> <p>(B) What health training is required for a license family child care provider once licensed?</p>

	<p>(2) Maintain current training in management of communicable disease and child abuse recognition and prevention.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>5101: 2-12-28</b></p> <p>(A) Each child care staff member and administrator of a child care center shall complete a minimum of fifteen clock hours of training annually, after the first day of employment, until a total of forty-five hours have been completed. The forty-five hours of training shall include trainings in child development, health and safety, child abuse recognition/prevention, first aid and management of communicable disease. At least twenty of the forty-five hours of training shall be in the topic of child development as defined in paragraph (G) of this rule.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>5101:2-12-10</b></p> <p>(B) What are the ongoing professional development training requirements for child care staff members?</p> <p>(1) Complete a minimum of six clock hours of training annually each fiscal year. The fiscal year is defined as July first through June thirtieth.</p> <p>(4) Health trainings taken pursuant to paragraph (A), (B), or (C) of this rule may not be used to meet the professional development training requirements.</p> <p>(5) Audiovisual or electronic media training may be used to meet the required six hours of annual training.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>5101:2-13-28</b></p> <p>(A) Each child care staff member and administrator of a type A home shall complete fifteen clock hours of training annually, after the first day of employment, until a total of forty-five hours have been completed. Training hours occurring on or after September 1, 1986 shall count for this requirement.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>5101:2-13-10</b></p> <p>(D) What are the on-going professional development requirements for the licensed family child care provider and child care staff members?</p> <p>(1) Complete a minimum of six clock hours of training annually in any of the categories listed in appendix B to this rule each fiscal year. The fiscal year is defined as July first through June thirtieth.</p> <p>(b) Health trainings taken pursuant to paragraph (A) of this rule may not be used to meet the professional development training requirements.</p>
	<p>(c) Audiovisual or electronic media training may be used to meet the required six hours of annual training.</p>
